Vision

Every child and young person should have the opportunity to reach their potential

The Children and Young People's Trust (the Trust) brings together all organisations that provide services to children, young people and families, such as health care, education, social care, youth offending, youth services and voluntary organisations in Warrington.

The Trust is part of the Warrington Partnership – the Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) for Warrington. It brings together the public services, business community and voluntary and community organisations to improve the quality of life for all who live and work in the borough.

The new Children and Young People's Plan sets out priorities for the work of the Trust for the next two years. It outlines how services will work together to improve outcomes for children and young people making sure every child matters. It takes forward work started in 2006, published in the first Children and Young People's Plan.

The focus of the Plan is to make an impact on :

- Eradicating child poverty;
- Narrowing the gap (ensuring that all children and young people have the opportunity to have good health, education and potential to get employment regardless of where they live, their family background or their ability); and
- Raising aspirations/promoting success.

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Outcome - Be Healthy

- Focus on a number of key areas to narrow the gap in health outcomes for children and young people.
- Improve the transition of children and young people from children's to adult services.
- Work together to improve health and social care services for children and young people with complex needs.

Outcome - Stay Safe

- Address the issues in The Lord Laming Report to keep children and young people safe in Warrington.
- Strengthen the commitment to confirming that safeguarding is everyone's business.
- By working together, commission services to improve provision for those children and young people who have been, or are in danger of being, abused.
- All agencies to have appropriate policies and procedures in place to support safeguarding.

Outcome - Enjoy and Achieve

- Help all children and young people to be involved in activities outside of the school day.
- Promote high standards in education by transforming the way education takes place in 21st century Warrington.
- Promote the importance of emotional well being for all our children and young people.

- Monitor the impact of children and young people's involvement on policy and practice.
- Improve the support available to parents.
- Promote community cohesion and sustainability.
